Brooke Martin was only 14 when she got the idea for 'iCPooch'; when she turned 15 years old, she was in the process of bringing her idea to the marketplace, selling her idea and making a profit. Her inspirational story and her unwavering belief in her idea, proves that no matter what age you are, you can succeed. 
