Career paths:

Sociology prepares you for making choices about your life and career not just by providing you with a dynamic set of subject-specific and transferable skills, but also by encouraging you to think about your own position in the world, how you got here, and what your life could be like in the future. Sociology improves your potential for adaptability in many jobs and careers by helping you to understand key social factors such as culture, race, ethnicity, gender, power, economics and inequality etc. Studying sociology opens up a range of careers in areas such as welfare, education, social research, and local and central government. Examples of jobs using sociology include: advice worker, community development worker, further education teacher, higher education lecturer, housing manager/officer, marketing executive, police officer, policy officer, secondary school teacher... Plus many more...

What can I do after I have completed this course?

GCSE Sociology is an excellent progression route to A-level Sociology. It enables students to develop an understanding of the interrelationships between individuals, groups, institutions and societies. A Level sociology gives you a strong foundation for further study of a range of academic subjects at degree level. It is a good foundation subject as the knowledge you learn can be applied to all aspects of society and it provides a variety of academic skills especially thinking critically about the world.
