Career paths:

The study of Geography links with a wide range of career paths across many different job sectors. The *map and locational skills* learnt in Geography will be helpful in careers including: pilots, armed forces, travel agents and journalists. Learning from *physical geography* links strongly with careers in environmental science, hazard management, weather forecasting and landscape gardening. In contrast, learning from *human geography* links more closely with careers such as an architect, lawyer, housing developer, town planning, social work and the emergency services. Geography is a well respected GCSE and A Level subject and is viewed highly by Universities.

What can I do after I have completed this course?

GCSE Geography prepares students extremely well, and is a requirement, for studying A Level Geography. Continuing to examine both human and physical forms of Geography is a key part of the A Level where students will explore the most current world events and their impacts. GCSE Geography also links to qualifications in Science, Travel and Tourism, Government and Politics and Citizenship.
