Work Experience

This is an essential part of year 12, usually in the final week of June, and is a great opportunity to experience the world of work either within a company linked to your preferred career path or somewhere you can learn transferrable skills.

Work experience is exceptionally competitive, and we strongly recommend you begin searching for opportunities from the start of year 12.

All work experience placements need to be logged on your Unifrog account so that we can track the various legal bits of paperwork.

Anyone interested in medical or veterinary pathways must complete relevant work experience before applying to university.

UCAS



Every year approximately 85% of our students apply for a university position, which needs to be via the UCAS portal. For those students unsure about whether they wish to find an apprenticeship or apply to university we recommend applying to university anyway – you can always cancel your applications, but if you don't apply you'll miss out on the opportunities at university.
